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

- Tight timeframes are a mixed blessing
- Communication re: expectations, format and timeframes is essential



Real world of producing overviews

Ideal situation

- Reviews available on all relevant interventions
- All reviews are up-to-date
- Overview authors keen, have lots of time
- Reality
 - Range of reviews is incomplete
 - Some are protocols in progress
 - Some are updates in progress
 - Some important interventions may not have reviews
 - Overview authors keen, have limited time

- Team composition
- Clearly defined scope
 - Population
 - Reviews to include
- Education of peer reviewers



Team composition

Interdisciplinary teams

- Librarian
- Statistician
- Clinicians
- Research assistant(s)
- Project manager
- Communication
 - Teleconferences
 - Email



Clearly defined scope

- Overviews ask a particular question of the SR evidence
- Scope creep occurs when
 - additional related questions are posed or different facets of the original question are added
 - authors ask to include more data (from non-Cochrane reviews, trials not included in the SRs, or from individual trials)
- Flexibility required



Education of peer reviewers

If a peer reviewer doesn't "get" the concept of an overview, the peer review is wasted



Conclusion

- Evolving concept many challenges remain
- Going beyond Cochrane reviews adds to comprehensiveness, adds complexity
- Important means of summarizing and presenting evidence
