# Issue 1: Involvement is context dependent especially as related to Topics 1-3 of the checklist

- Organization undertaking guideline development
  - Government
    - - contracted out (arm's length approach but parameters within which to operate) or
    - - internal/ standing group (decision making)
  - Private
- Location/Resource Availability
  - High Resource setting
    - May be less involvement, where protective institutions/structures already exist
  - LMIC
    - Capacity building considerations, more involvement

# Topic 7: Conflict of Interest?

- A transparent and documented approach to identifying, selecting, and assigning roles to guideline development group members will minimize potential conflicts of interest
  - E.g. undertaking a stakeholder analysis at onset of guideline development
- Such an approach will also dictate level of engagement
